Bacup and Rossendale News 19.9.1860. Henry Ashworth, the keeper of the Beerhouse known as Little London, which is situated on Rooley Moor on the road leading to Rochdale, the traffic on which was considerable, applied for a beer licence. The applicant has been in business for the last eight years. Application refused. Granted later. (Beerhouse keepers had to apply each year for the renewal of their licenses.

Bacup and Rossendale News 31.1.1874. John Ashworth (Wrong name), of the Dog and Partridge, Little London, Cowpe Lench, was charged with keeping his house open during prohibited hours. Fined 40s and costs.

Bacup Times 9.12.1876. To be Let, beerhouse and farm, Little London. Apply Glen Top Brewery.

Bacup and Rossendale News 23.2.1878. Christopher Wilson, of the Little London beerhouse, Cowpe Lench, was summoned for permitting drunkenness. Fined 20s and costs.

Bacup Times 23.2.1878. Benjamin Nuttall was fined 5s and costs for being drunk in the Little London beerhouse, Cowpe.

Bacup Times 25.8.1883. To be Let, the Dog and Partridge beerhouse and land attached, known as Little London. Apply Ashworth Law, auctioneer, Waterfoot.
